Students showing symptoms of any illness are staying home, which is much appreciated and contributes to our school's overall safety. On the school end, we are continuing our cleaning protocol that was put in place in our reopening guidelines. We continue to screen and take temperatures, limit visitors, and teachers are wiping down desks frequently. Mr. Myers wipes door handles and cleans bathrooms daily. At the end of the day, once everyone has left, we fog the classrooms with an EPA approved disinfectant. We have been very creative with our classroom layouts, keeping students safely apart, and our students and staff are very cooperative in wearing their masks and abiding by Diocesan policies. All of these combined efforts are working! Let's pray our community remains healthy now and in the months to come.

On October 6, the Diocese of Charleston performed an Internal Review of our school. St. Andrew was rated on 31 indicators in four different categories. The four categories are: insufficient, initiating, improving, and impacting. We strive to be in the 4th category of impacting, illustrating that desired practices are deeply entrenched in the culture of the school. I am pleased to report that our school had zero ratings at insufficient, zero ratings at initiating, nine ratings at improving, and 22 at impacting, the highest rating possible! We are very proud of our report! The Diocese of Charleston recognizes that our school is driven by our Mission Statement and that our stakeholders work collaboratively to create and deliver top quality instruction, a safe environment, and an atmosphere of service, all delivered in the light of Gospel values. We are well on our way to renewed accreditation through Cognia. Thank you to everyone for your continued support!

We have much to be thankful for in this season. We continue to pray for safety, health, our country, and our school. We are blessed to have been in school for a full quarter and to be able to provide a quality education to virtual students and students in our BRAVE at Home Program. 

It is hard to believe that we are into the fall season and already through the first quarter of the school year! I would like to extend a **congretivations** to all of you for your transparency, communication, and patience as we navigate this school year during the COVID-19 pandemic. By working together, we will continue to keep our children, faculty, and staff as safe as we possibly can. We understand that a face to face learning environment has an inherent risk.

This month, I would like to address the importance of having a thermometer in your home. An elevated temperature is often the first sign of a developing illness or infection. Several options are available on the market, including a digital oral, tympanic, temporal, axillary (don't buy those, they do not work), and even rectal thermometers. Price points for thermometers are very reasonable to hundreds of dollars for the medical-grade versions. I know that Grandma always relied on the back of her hand as a screening tool, but that type of temperature screening is not accurate. The first question I ask most of you when your child is home ill is "What is the temperature?" Please consider purchasing a thermometer for your home. 




